



## Here's to a Healthier Arkansas River Valley

At Saint Mary's Regional Medical Center, our goal is to deliver the best healthcare available in the Arkansas River Valley as we seek to exceed the expectations of all those we serve. With the help of dedicated physicians, employees, volunteers, and Board members, along with your continued support and encouragement, we continue our passionate pursuit of excellence. While delivering quality healthcare, the single most important contribution we make, there are many other ways we make a positive impact on the communities we serve. Here are a few of the other ways we are making a difference..

### Over \$9.769 Million In Capital Improvements

Saint Mary's is in the process of enhancing our regional Cancer Center which includes: 1) the addition of a new 16-slice CT simulator and treatment planning system which was installed at the end of 2010; 2) the replacement of our linear high power accelerator with a new and improved Elekta 15Mv high power linear accelerator; 3) the addition of a new Elekta low power accelerator to accommodate additional shallow tumor treatment. With this new equipment we will be able to administer the latest cancer treatment available to more patients than ever before. The precision administration of radiation therapy will be enhanced by the ability to deliver additional precise IGRT treatments. The total investment will approach \$5.2 million.

In addition to the Cancer Center, we have completed a major renovation of our Women's Center. Investments of \$1.4 million included new equipment such as digital mammography; portable and stationary ultrasound; a new nurse call system; infant security system, and all private delivery rooms. Some of the other new equipment recently added has included a new lithotripsy system for treatment of kidney stones, a new digital colonoscope, a new recovery monitoring system, and new ventilators.

A new Adult Behavioral Health unit is being added to the facility to address a need in our market. The 15 bed unit will be open to patients between the ages of 18 and 64 dealing with depression, anxiety, suicidal thoughts and other mental health issues. A capital investment of over \$400,000 will be required to ready the existing unit for transition to a behavioral health unit.

In fact, just last year, we invested over \$2.5 million in our facilities which, in addition to the above, included technology replacement, information technology additions/updates, and routine facility upkeep and maintenance.

### Contributing To Our Local Tax Base

Last year Saint Mary's Regional Medical Center paid over \$1.96 million in taxes which helped to support our city, county, and state. This included sales taxes as well as property taxes. These dollars help to support local schools, development of roads, recruitment of business and industry, and other needed services.

### Helping Those In Need

Saint Mary's Regional Medical Center provided more than \$226 million in uncompensated care last year, which included the amounts not covered by government-supported programs such as Medicare and Medicaid. This amount also includes more than \$27.3 million for charity care, discounts for the uninsured, and bad debts, incurred as we cared for many people without sufficient resources.

### Adding New Physicians

During the past year, Saint Mary's Regional Medical Center added five new physicians to our highly respected medical staff, including specialists in obstetrics and gynecology.

### One Of Our Community's Major Employers

Providing an annual payroll of over \$39 million to 804 employees, Saint Mary's Regional Medical Center is one of the largest employers in this region. We thank you for choosing us for your healthcare needs. With your support, together we can continue making healthcare and our community better.
