At Capital Medical Center, our goal is to deliver the best healthcare available in the South Sound Region as we seek to exceed the expectations of all those we serve. Here are a few of the other ways we are making a difference.

Over \$1.2 Million In Capital Improvements

In 2010 we began preparing for major growth in the coming year. We purchased surgical equipment for our orthopedic program. We also purchased the ESD 113 property across the street from the hospital. In mid-2011, we will complete and open a new outpatient diagnostic center. This center will house a new, technologically advanced 64 Slice Cat Scan (CT) and Wide-Bore MRI. Our patients will receive a full range of diagnostic imaging services at the new location. In early 2011 we also added a neurosurgery program to address community need. We have made significant investments to include the purchase of a specialized microscope used in neurosurgery and we will add a second new MRI that will be housed in the hospital's radiology department.

In fact, we invested over \$1.2 million in our facilities last year which, in addition to the above, included technology replacement, information technology additions/updates, and routine facility upkeep and maintenance.

Contributing To Our Local Tax Base

Last year, Capital Medical Center paid over \$3.3 million in taxes which helped to support our city, county and state. This included sales taxes as well as property taxes. These dollars help to support local schools, development of roads, recruitment of business and industry, and other needed services.

Helping Those In Need

Capital Medical Center provided more than \$134 million in uncompensated care last year, which included the amounts not covered by government-sponsored programs such as Medicare and Medicaid. This amount also includes more than \$8.1 million for charity care, discounts for the uninsured, and bad debts, incurred as we cared for many people without sufficient resources.

Adding New Physicians

During the past year, Capital Medical Center added three new physicians to our highly respected medical staff, including specialists in internal medicine, family medicine, and urology.
