Over \$1.1 Million In Capital Improvements

In the coming months, we will complete our Cataract Center of Excellence. We have also added a 16-slide CT scanner and made a number of quality improvements to our advanced facility including updating our surgical center with new laparoscopic surgical equipment.

In fact, we invested over \$1.1 million in our facilities last year which, in addition to the above, included technology replacement, information technology additions/updates, and routine facility upkeep and maintenance.

Contributing To Our Local Tax Base

Last year, Jacksonville Medical Center paid over \$446,000 in taxes which helped to support our city, county and state. This included sales taxes as well as property taxes. These dollars help to support local schools, development of roads, recruitment of business and industry, and other needed services.

Helping Those In Need

Jacksonville Medical Center provided over \$57.7 million in uncompensated care last year, which included the amounts not covered by government-sponsored programs such as Medicare and Medicaid. This amount also includes more than \$7.7 million for charity care, discounts for the uninsured, and bad debts, incurred as we cared for many people without sufficient resources.

Adding New Physicians

During the past year, Jacksonville Medical Center added three new physicians to our highly respected medical staff, including specialists in Pediatrics and Family Practice. We also introduced cardiology to the market with a Satellite Clinic.
