At Willamette Valley Medical Center, our goal is to deliver the best healthcare available in the region as we seek to exceed the expectations of all those we serve. With the help of dedicated physicians, employees, volunteers and Board members, along with your continued support and encouragement, we continue our passionate pursuit of excellence. While delivering quality healthcare is the single most important contribution we make, there are many other ways we make a positive impact on the communities we serve. Here are a few of the other ways we are making a difference.

Over \$4.1 Million In Capital Improvements

During 2010 Willamette Valley Medical Center made significant capital improvements. Our most significant investment was the upgrade of our Cancer Center equipment. New software and hardware was installed to enhance our radiotherapy services (\$1.6 million). Other capital investments included \$347,000 in Mammography equipment, the replacement of a Flouro Unit in Radiology for \$233,000, an infant security system \$84,000, plus equipment for the Operating room and other areas of the hospital.

In fact, we invested over \$ 4.1 million in our facilities last year which, in addition to the above, included technology replacement, for information technology additions/updates, and routine facility upkeep and maintenance.

Contributing To Our Local Tax Base

Last year, Willamette Valley Medical Center paid over \$1.0 million in taxes which helped to support our city, county and state. In fact, WVMC is the second largest property taxpayer in Yamhill County. These dollars help to support local schools, development of roads, recruitment of business and industry, and other needed services.

Helping Those In Need

Willamette Valley Medical Center provided more than \$149 million in uncompensated care last year, which included the amounts not covered by government-sponsored programs such as Medicare and Medicaid. This amount also includes more than \$16.3 million for charity care, discounts for the uninsured, and bad debts, incurred as we cared for many people without sufficient resources.

Adding New Physicians

During the past year, Willamette Valley Medical Center added four new physicians to our highly respected medical staff, including specialists in Orthopedic Surgery, General Surgery and Otolaryngology (ENT).

One Of Our Community's Major Employers

Cancer Foundation Helps Those in Need

With a commitment to provide medical care for every cancer patient, regardless of their ability to pay, but wanting to do even more, Willamette Valley Medical Center started a non-profit foundation to help in more ways. The hospital provided seed money seven years ago to start the innovative foundation, and the hospital still helps to fund the director's salary and provide space for operations.

Since 2003, the Willamette Valley Cancer Foundation has helped cancer patients and their families throughout northwestern Oregon. "Cancer puts a strain on people's health, their finances, and family life," said Kelly McGraw, CTR, Executive Director. "The Foundation, through donor and volunteer generosity, supports these brave patients in their fight against cancer. By providing grant assistance to help ease the financial burden while they are undergoing treatment, patients can focus on getting healthy and adapting to huge change. We help with basic needs such as rent payments, utilities, food, transportation to and from treatment, lodging, medical premium payments, prosthetics, and many other means of support."

To date, over \$100,000 in grants has been distributed to assist local individuals during their time of need. The Foundation also assists patients in connecting with local resources, providing financial assistance, and participating in educational and prevention activities in the community. They've also established a resource library in the local Cancer Center where patients can check out books and other materials and use the internet.

The mission of this nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization is "to foster hope through the support of cancer patients, education and prevention." And that's just what they are doing – for hundreds of people.
